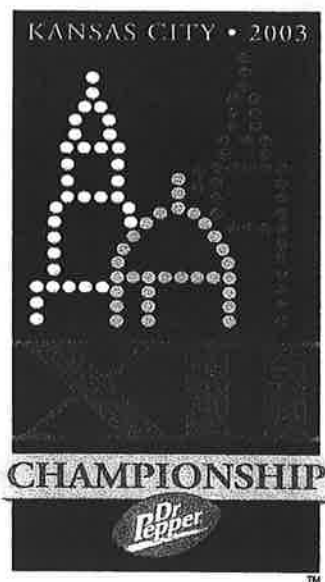

- With zero TD passes in the game, it snaps a 25-game streak that OU has thrown a TD pass in a game.
- The 28-point loss is the worst OU loss in the Bob Stoops era and worst loss since 1998 vs. Texas A&M (29-0).
- Tonight is the first time OU has been out-gained in total yards this season.
- Tonight is the first time in 18 games that OU has committed more turnovers than its opponent.
- The loss is OU's first in the Big 12 Championship game. They had won their previous two title games.
- The loss snaps OU's nation's longest winning streak of 14. (Oklahoma State, 2002)

KANSAS STATE Notes

- KSU is making its third Dr. Pepper Big 12 Championship appearance. KSU previously appeared in the Big 12 title game in 1998 and 2000.
- Oklahoma's **rushing** TD in the first quarter was the second rushing TD allowed by KSU since Oct. 18 vs. Colorado. The other was by Zach Abron of Missouri on Nov. 22. It was also only the second rushing TD allowed in 23 quarters.
- **Darren Sproles'** 55-yard rush was his third longest run from scrimmage this year.
- **Ell Roberson's** four TD passes makes him KSU's all-time leader in TD passes (37) and breaks the single-season record with 24 TD passes, both previously held by Michael Bishop. Roberson also is tied for the school record in TD's responsible for with 37. His four TD passes also ties a KSU single-game record.
- **Brian Casey's** TD reception is his second of the season.
- KSU has scored in 90 straight games. The last time they were shutout was in 1996, a 12-0 loss to Colorado.
- Ell Roberson's 63-yard TD pass to James Terry equals KSU's longest TD pass of the season. Roberson and Terry connected for 63 yards against Nebraska.
- James Terry became KSU single-season receiving yards leader following his 63-yard TD reception, passing Quincy Morgan (2002). He is also now tied with Kevin Lockett for single-season TD receptions (13).
- **Ell Roberson** moved into seventh place on KSU single-season passing yards list with 2,206 yards.
- **James McGill's** second quarter interception was his team-leading sixth INT of the season and sixth of his career.
- **Darren Sproles'** 60-yard TD reception was his longest reception from scrimmage this season.
- KSU is 9-0 this season when leading at halftime.
- OU's 63 yards on the opening drive of the second half are the most against KSU this season. KSU has allowed points on a second half opening drive just once this season (vs. Kansas).
- **Darren Sproles'** 100-plus yard rushing performance is his 19th of his career and ninth this year.
- KSU has scored on its opening drive of the second half seven times this season (six were TDs).
- **Darren Sproles** has rushed for 200-plus yards in three of his last four games.
- **Antoine Polite's** TD reception is his first of his career.
- **Ted Sims'** interception was his first career INT and TD.
- KSU has out-gained 13 of 14 opponents this year in total offense. Colorado is the only team to out-gain KSU this season.
- KSU's is now 3-1 at Arrowhead Stadium all-time (2-0 is 2003).
- KSU's Big 12 Championship is its first since the 1934 Big Six championship.
- KSU's victory is its first in three tries in the Big 12 Championship game.
- KSU's victory is its first against the nation's No. 1 ranked team. They were 0-9 entering tonight's game.
- KSU is now 3-22 against top 10 ranked teams in the Bill Snyder era.
- KSU's 11th victory of the season makes them the only team in the nation to win 11 games in six of the last seven years (72-18).
- KSU has won six of the last nine encounters vs. OU, and the win snaps a three-game OU win streak.
- KSU will play in its first BCS Bowl, the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl on Jan 2, 2004.

Postgame Notes

▷ K-State's 35-7 victory over the top-ranked Oklahoma Sooners gives the Wildcats their first Big 12 Conference Championship and the school's first berth into a Bowl Championship Series game... It is also the first title for the Wildcats since K-State claimed the 1934 Big Six Conference title... The victory also snapped the Sooners 14-game winning streak, breaking the longest winning streak in the country.

▷ On a 64-yard touchdown pass from Ell Roberson to James Terry with 11:35 left in the second quarter Wildcats grabbed a 14-7 lead, marking only the second time all year Oklahoma has trailed in a game and was the largest deficit the Sooners had faced all year... K-State never trailed again on their way to a 35-7 victory, with their largest lead being the final margin of victory... The 35 points was the most Oklahoma had surrendered to an opponent all season... Coming into the game, Oklahoma had only given up 13.2 points per game.

▷ The Sooners defense allowed a number of single game highs against the Wildcats offense... Kansas State gained 262 yards in the first half, the most by any opponent against the Sooners for a single half... Heading into the game, Oklahoma ranked first in the country by holding opponents to 233.7 yards per game... The 519 yards of total offense by the Wildcats was the most by any opponent this year against the Sooners.

▷ James Terry had 63 receiving yards on the day, giving him 1,735 yards for his career, good for seventh on the all-time list... He now has 1,174 yards receiving on the season, a new Kansas State single season record. His 64-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter was the longest reception of the career, it also marked the longest pass Oklahoma had give up all season.

▷ Senior quarterback Ell Roberson threw for 227 yards on the day, moving his career mark to 4,805 and surpassing Johnathan Beasley (4,642 career passing yards) for fourth on K-State's all-time passing list... His four passing touchdowns today gives him 37 on his career, moving him past Michael Bishop (36) and into first on the all-time list... The 4 touchdown passes also broke a Big 12 Championship game record... The four touchdowns also tied a career high (Oklahoma State, 10/11/2003) and a school record.

▷ Darren Sproles 60-yard touchdown reception marked a career long and was only his second touchdown reception of his career... The touchdown was the 36th (33 rush, 2 rush, 1 punt) of his career, second on the all-time list, trailing only Roberson (38)... Sproles had 88 yards receiving today, the highest total of his career.

▷ Sproles also had 235 yards rushing on the day, moving his career total to 3,623 which ranks first on the all-time list... The 235 yards rushing was the most by an individual ever vs. Oklahoma and only the second time a running back has gone over 100 yards rushing against the Sooners this season... It was also the ninth time this season Sproles has surpassed the 100-yard plateau and the 19th time he has accomplished the feat in his career... His 60-yard rush late in the fourth quarter was the longest the Sooners defense has surrendered all season.

▷ James McGill recorded his sixth interception of the season (sixth of his career) when he ended a Sooners drive by picking off Jason White in the endzone. It was only White's seventh interception of the season and only the third time this year the Sooners turned the ball over in the endzone.

▷ Antoine Polite's 10-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter was his first of the season and career.

▷ Ted Sims' fourth quarter interception return for a touchdown was the first touchdown and interception for his career.

▷ With the Sooners' Kejuan Jones' 42-yard touchdown run on the first drive, it marked the first time an opponent had scored on the opening drive of the game since Baylor (11/1) opened with a field goal. It was also the first time since Colorado (10/18) the defense allowed a touchdown to open the game.

- Sophomore Trey DiCarlo broke the NCAA single-season PAT made record with his 72 extra point at the end of the Sooners' only score. DiCarlo came into the game tied for the record.
- With his 298 yard passing night, senior quarterback Jason White moved ahead of Josh Heupel's 2000 single-season passing total into second place on the school's single-season passing list with a current total of 3,744.
- Junior wide receiver Mark Clayton went over the 100-yard receiving mark for the eighth time this season with his 104 yard performance.
- Junior wide receiver Will Peoples pulled down a career high eight receptions tonight. His previous best was six catches against Missouri in 2002.
- Sophomore running back Kejuan Jones made a career-long scamper of 42 yards into the end zone on the Sooners' first possession of the game.
- Sophomore tight end Chris Chester made his first career start at tight end. Chester started along with fellow tight end Lance Donley in a two tight end set which was the first look of that type this season.

KANSAS STATE HEAD COACH BILL SNYDER

On the emotion of this victory:

"I'm excited about Ell Roberson. He's the toughest quarterback in the nation. I'm excited for guys like Darren Sproles. Want to vote for a Heisman candidate? If you've seen any of our ballgames you'll know what I'm talking about. We're excited for those young guys who play the game. Ted Sims who was not a starter at the beginning of the season makes a major play and a major contribution to the victory. Those are the guys who I'm excited about.

"I think it probably becomes the most important (victory) as we have never won a conference championship before. I think there's been a lot of wins in the past 15 years that we cherish a great deal. This one probably is maybe the most significant."

On the poise of QB Ell Roberson:

"Ell's an amazing young guy. Poise, I think it's been a part of his game since the first game he became a starter which started with Oklahoma. He's got such a command of what we do. He's so confident of his capabilities and confident in his teammates and confident in the system and that lends itself to poise. He's matured so wonderfully over the years and that adds to it as well.

I don't make a lot of major statements about injuries during the season. Ell Roberson is the toughest quarterback playing the game. Maybe the toughest football player, I'm talking about physical toughness and mental toughness. When I get an injury report week in and week out Ell Roberson is got a list of ailments that would cover an entire football team. He spends half of his life in tubs and training rooms and comes out to practice and practices every single day. Never takes a snap off, never takes a day off. He's an amazing young man."

On combating Oklahoma's defensive speed:

"They're undeniably a very fast football team. They understand how to play against option football. And yet we were able to get some things that we might be able to consider over pursuit. Sometimes we did, sometimes we didn't. That was our intent and enough of it paid off."

On the play of KSU's special teams:

"It could've been a little bit better. We had an opportunity to down one on the six-inch line and for whatever reason we backed ourselves into the end zone so they got it back out on the 20. But Jared Brite hit the ball extremely well all day. Jared has averaged about 43 yards per punt in the previous six ballgames. Our net punt is well over 41 yards and that's been good over the last six weeks. Our kickoff coverage unit which I told in the locker room that has been horrible for a good portion of the year really was excellent tonight. 25 yards was the longest return of the night. I was really pleased with our special teams. You go back and look and remember when we talked all along and you asked the question what do we have to do? We can't turn the ball over and if you look at the stats we didn't turn the ball over. We said we couldn't give up any big plays. We didn't give up any big plays. We said we had to be excellent in the kicking game and we were pretty good in the kicking game. So those things proved to be true."

“First of all I have to thank our coaches because they put us in the right positions and I think everybody on the defense just played as best as they could possibly play and it just feels good to put that many points on the number one team in the nation. I feel like we should be the number one team in the nation.”

LB Josh Buhl:

On how K-State got to this point:

“Basically we just all came together. We were tired of the way we were playing and tired of the losses and we just decided to make something happen and we did. We decided to play as a team and we haven't stopped.”

On getting pressure on White and hitting all night::

“Our defensive line did a great job. We knew all week that we had to have a relentless pass rush and they did it. I'm not sure if they allowed us to do that but we had guys out there that weren't going to take no for an answer and they were going to get after them. They didn't stop getting after them. We knew that was going to be a key to win the game along with a lot of other keys and they did a great job

On if this win is sweeter after a three game losing streak:

“Most definitely. Of course we would have liked it to have been a little sweeter by not losing those games and maybe having a chance to play for the national title. But what we went through and the adversity that we came

through from doing all that and how we just came together as a team was unbelievable. We just started playing together as a team and it's worked for us and it's something that we just wanted to do. Going through those three losses, it was hurtful. We just wanted to change it and we did."

"I agree. I think especially after the loss today I think Oklahoma definitely should be in the national championship. They are going to play hard in the national championship and I believe in them and we just wanted to make sure they didn't win against us. Hopefully they still go. We knew that would be a possibility. It doesn't matter to us but I hope they do go."

On Coach Snyder's first big twelve title in fifteen years:

"I'm really happy that it got to happen on my terms. I'm really glad that I got a chance to be a part of his first Big 12 Championship. You know something we set off at the beginning of the year as one of our goals. It just feels great to us because it was something that we wanted to do and we ended up accomplishing that and that means a lot to this team and this program. I'm just glad I got to do it on my senior year."

On his touchdown celebration:

"Our D-line was making them scramble all day and really getting to his head. He was so scared and I just read the pass and then just it came. It happened. After that I just focused on the end zone."

OKLAHOMA HEAD COACH BOB STOOPS

Opening Statement:

“First, my congratulations to Kansas State. They played an excellent, well played football game, and really just out played us in every part of the football game, out coached us and put their selves in a great position and won a Big 12 Championship. So, our hats are off to them and they really took it to us in every part of the game and they deserve the credit they will get and congratulations to them. We will see where our situation and future is after this tomorrow. We would of liked to do a lot of things better, playing and executing, thought we had some opportunities early in the game that we weren’t able to come through with and they made the plays that mattered. We had opportunities to make some plays and didn’t and in the end that is what matters in these kinds of games and that is what wins for you and loses for you.”

On Ell Roberson being able to pass against a solid Oklahoma defense:

“He’s thrown well all year. He had the big, long throw, the 70 yard completion on first down, that was a well thrown football and we had it well covered. Their guy (WR James Terry) comes back and makes a nice play and makes a nice catch and brings it in for a touchdown. We missed a tackle after the catch and here is Antonio Perkins who has played well for us and in good position on the play and that is one of those situation were you have to make a play when you get an opportunity and they came back and made a nice run. Ell threw the ball nice and then you have some big plays on screens as well.”

On the success of the Kansas State offense and if the Sooner offense not being able to score points in the beginning of the third quarter had an effect on the Wildcats success:

“I think it all goes together. You win and lose as a team. We sure did that today. Sure, our offense at times when we had opportunities didn’t produce, whether it’s touchdowns or field goals. Defensively you look at the first half and we are down 21-7 and they got a ton of yards and they are all on three plays. A screen that goes out the gate, a long pass, the run that Darren Sproles makes, credit him it was a great run. We have a blitz on and hit him five yards deep in the backfield and he goes 60 yards through the tackle. Again give the guy credit, he made a great play, we were in position to make the play and didn’t. Then all of a sudden there it is 21-7 off of two plays.”

On if today’s game will have any impact on Jason White’s chances of winning the Heisman:

“I don’t know, some guys are sitting at home relaxing and not playing and others are, and playing a championship team against one of the best teams you will play the entire year. I believe most people take that into consideration. I will say this I can not tell you how much I respect and admire the guy. He was knocked around today and fought through it. He was beat up on, dazed for a while, still fighting back, and the guy to me fought as well as he could.”
