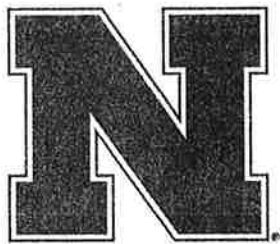

Boomer Sooner: The Oklahoma Sooners improved to 7-1 in the Big 12 championship game with their 23-20 victory over Nebraska. Coach Bob Stoops has been at the school for all eight games. Nebraska dropped to 2-4 all-time at this event.

South vs. North: The South division now has an 11-4 record over its North counterparts. The South also has now won seven straight. Kansas State (2003) was the last North team to win the conference title.

Crimson-and-creamed: OU finished the night with seven sacks, which was the second highest total in title game history. Defensive lineman Pryce Macon had a team-high three sacks and Frank Alexander had two more. Nebraska's Ndamukong Suh was a one-man wrecking crew with a record 4.5 sacks in 2009.

Jones' passing fancy: OU quarterback Landry Jones finished the game with 342 passing yards, which was the third-highest total ever. He completed 23 of 41 passes and had one touchdown. Cameron Kenney was his favorite target with six catches for 65 yards. Kenny Stills caught a 49-yard touchdown pass and came 1 yard shy of scoring another.

Nebraska's David everywhere: The Huskers had a defensive stalwart themselves in linebacker Lavonte David. He had a team-high 17 tackles for the Huskers, which tied the Big 12 record set by Texas A&M's Dat Nguyen in 1998. OU's leading tackler was safety Jonathan Nelson with 11.

Henery breaks own FG record: Nebraska K Alex Henery booted a 53-yard field goal with 6:11 remaining in the first quarter. It was the longest field goal in Big 12 Championship game history. Who's record did Henery break? His own. Henery nailed a 52-yard field goal against Texas in the 2009 Big 12 title game.

Helu in record books: Nebraska's Roy Helu's 66-yard touchdown run in the first quarter tied for the sixth-longest play in Big 12 Championship game history and longest scoring run ever.

Rex does it again: Nebraska running back Rex Burkhead came into the game with two touchdown passes this season. He's now 3-for-3 after throwing a 5-yard scoring pass to Kyler Reed with 12:14 remaining in the second quarter.

Some slippery fingers: Nebraska found its way into the record book by fumbling the ball too many times. The Huskers fumbled five times and lost three. The five fumbles tied the record for the most ever, equaling the same number of fumbles by Kansas State (1998) and Nebraska (1997). The three lost fumbles tied for the second most in title game history.

OU's Lewis has open arms: Who benefitted from all those Nebraska fumbles? OU's Travis Lewis had two fumble recoveries, which is the most by any individual at this event. The weakside linebacker also had a critical interception in the Nebraska end zone for a touchback.

Notable: Oklahoma won despite going just 1-for-16 on third-down conversions. Nebraska didn't do much better, going 4-for-17. ... Nebraska tied the record for fewest penalties (three) and set a record for the lowest penalty yardage (15 yards) in a title game.

Crossing the one million mark: From the first event at what was called the TWA Dome in 1996 to the final Big 12 Championship game at Cowboys Stadium, more than 1 million fans experienced the league's signature event. Saturday's game had the fourth-largest crowd of 78,810.

OKLAHOMA

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GAME NOTES

- With the win, Oklahoma won its league-leading seventh Big 12 Championship, including four of the last five Big 12 titles. Oklahoma will make its 44th bowl appearance, and fifth appearance in the Fiesta Bowl.
- OU is now 45-38-3 all-time against Nebraska, 38-6 against the Big 12 North and 7-1 in the Big 12 title game. Oklahoma is now 2-0 against the Cornhuskers in the Big 12 title game, the Sooners beat Nebraska 21-7 in the 2006 title game in Kansas City.
- Head Coach Bob Stoops is now 128-31 overall in his 12th season at OU. He is 84-19 against the Big 12, 7-1 in the Big 12 title game and 6-1 against Nebraska.
- OU has forced at least one turnover in 140 of Stoops' 158 games and has at least one interception in 103 of the last 138. The Sooners forced a season-high six turnovers in tonight's game.
- Eight different receivers caught a pass for Oklahoma in tonight's game, it is the eighth time this season that at least eight different receivers have a reception and the 10th that at least seven receivers have caught a pass. OU has had seven games with at least nine receivers catching a pass. The season high came against Florida State when 12 Sooners had receptions.
- The Sooners' defense broke up five passes against Nebraska to bring OU's season total to 63, a team-best since the current school record of 110 was set in 2000.
- The OU defense had a season team-high seven sacks against Nebraska. The team's previous best was four, set against both Florida State and Iowa State. OU also had a season-high 14 tackles-for-loss, the third time to reach double digits this season (Cincinnati and Missouri).

FRANK ALEXANDER

- Frank Alexander set a career high with four tackles for loss on the night. Alexander's previous high of three came this year against Iowa State.

RYAN BROYLES

- With his 47-yard reception in the third quarter, Ryan Broyles surpassed Mark Clayton as the OU career receiving yards leader and the single-season receiving yards leader. Broyles finished the night with three receptions for 61 yards to give the junior 3,259 career receiving yards and 1,452 on the season.

LANDRY JONES

- With his start tonight, Landry Jones becomes just the 10th quarterback in OU history to start at least 20 consecutive games.
- With his 49-yard touchdown pass to Kenny Stills, Jones is tied with Jason White (2004) at No. 4 for single-season touchdowns by an OU quarterback with 35. Jones trails Sam Bradford at No. 1 and No. 3 with 50 (2008) and 35 (2007), respectively, and Jason White at No. 2 with 40 (2003).
- Jones had 23 completions on the night to up his season total to 371, breaking the OU single-season completions record. Current OU quarterbacks coach, Josh Heupel previously held the record with 349 completions in 1999.
- Jones also moved to No. 2 on the OU career completions list with 632. Jones passed Jason White's 627 (1999-04) and trails Josh Heupel's 654 (1999-00).
- With his 41 attempts, Jones now has 568 attempts on the season, breaking the previous school record of 553, set by Josh Heupel, in 1999.

CAMERON KENNEY

- Kenney tied his career-high for receptions in a game tonight with six grabs for 65 yards, it is the third time the senior has recorded six catches in a game.

TRAVIS LEWIS

- With his interception in the second quarter, Lewis tied Sam Allen (1951-52) for the OU record for career interceptions by a linebacker with eight. It was Lewis' third interception of the season.
- Lewis also recovered two fumbles in tonight's game, the first and second of his career.

BY THE NUMBERS

Kenny Stills now owns the OU record for receiving yards in a season by a freshman with 709. Stills entered the game trailing Ryan Broyles at 678.

The Sooners have forced at least one turnover in 140 of Stoops' 158 games, with at least one interception in 103 of the last 138.

The OU defense has now broken up 63 passes this season, a team-high since the current record for passes broken up was set at 110 in 2000.

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PRYCE MACON

- Macon recorded a career-high five tackles for loss in the first half (-24 yards), becoming just the ninth player in Oklahoma history with at least five TFLs in a game. Macon's previous best was 2.5 tackles for loss of 11 yards against Texas Tech on Nov. 13, 2010. Cedric Jones holds the Oklahoma record with six TFLs vs. Texas Tech in 1994.

- Macon also had a career-high three sacks in the game, becoming the 22nd Sooner with at least three in a game and the first since Jeremy Beal accomplished the feat in back-to-back games against Tulsa and Miami (2009).

DEMARCO MURRAY

- With his five receptions for 60 yards against Nebraska, Murray moved to No. 14 in the OU career receiving list with 1,572 yards. He finished with 60 yards receiving, the fifth time this season he eclipsed 50 yards.

KENNY STILLS

- Stills made a 49-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter and has now scored a touchdown in three of the last four games. The 49-yarder ties for his second-longest reception this season. His career long is 59 yards against Texas Tech. Stills also had a 49-yarder against Baylor. All three were scoring strikes.

- With his three receptions for 83 yards, Stills set the Oklahoma record for receiving yards in a season by a freshman with 713 yards, previously held by Ryan Broyles with 687. Stills entered the game holding the OU record for receptions in a season by a freshman and now has 53 on the season. Stills is second in school history for touchdown receptions by a freshman with five, trailing Broyles who had six in 2008.

Nebraska Post-Game Notes

Big 12 Championship, Nebraska vs. Oklahoma—Dec. 4, 2010

► Nebraska dropped to 2-4 all-time in Big 12 Championship Games, including 0-2 against Oklahoma and 0-2 in Cowboys Stadium. It was NU's third straight loss in the Big 12 title game. Oklahoma increased its all-time edge in the series to 45-38-3, including 6-4 in the Big 12 era.

► Nebraska dropped to 10-3 with tonight's loss, preventing NU from its first 11-win regular season since 2001. Nebraska dropped to 2-2 against ranked teams this season and 1-1 against top-10 teams. Bo Pelini's record at Nebraska dropped to 30-11 and 1-2 vs. Oklahoma.

► Senior I-back **Roy Helu Jr.** had a 66-yard touchdown run in the first quarter of tonight's game. It was Helu's seventh TD run of at least 50 yards this season, with five of those covering at least 65 yards. Helu's run was a one-play scoring drive, NU's seventh one-play scoring drive of the season with five of those on Helu rushes. The 66-yard touchdown run was the longest in Big 12 Championship Game history, surpassing a 63-yard run by Darren Sproles in 2003.

► The 66-yard run also marked the third straight season Helu Jr. has had a run of 50+yards against the Sooners. In his career, Helu has 386 rushing yards on 47 carries against the Sooners, an average of 8.2 yards per carry.

► Helu Jr. finished the night with 91 yards on 11 carries for his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season. Helu Jr. also pushed his season rushing total to 1,211 yards. His 1,211 yardage total ranks 12th in Nebraska history and is third among Nebraska seniors.

► Senior place-kicker **Alex Henery** connected on a 53-yard field goal in the first quarter of tonight's game to give NU a 10-0 lead. Henery's 53-yard field goal is the longest in Big 12 Championship Game history, breaking his own 52-yarder against Texas in last year's game. Henery's kick was also the longest ever by a Nebraska player away from Lincoln, surpassing his own 52-yarder at Oklahoma State earlier this season. Henery improved to 18-of-19 on field goals this season and 68-of-76 in his career.

► Henery continued his amazing postseason success. He improved to 14-of-14 in the postseason on field goal attempts. He has made three field goals of 50 yards or more in the postseason and nine of 40 yards or more.

► Henery also became Nebraska's all-time leading scorer in tonight's game. His eight points tonight give him 396 career points, surpassing the previous record of 388 by Kris Brown from 1995 to 1998. He connected on two PATs tonight, extending his perfect PAT season to 53-of-53.

► Junior linebacker **Lavonte David** had 17 tackles in tonight's game, his eighth double-figure tackle game of the season. The 17 tackles tied the Big 12 Championship Game record set by Dat Nguyen in the 1998 title game. David pushed his season tackle total to 145 moving him into second place on the NU single-season chart. He is four tackles from Barrett Ruud's single-season mark of 149 tackles in 2003.

► Nebraska sophomore tight end **Kyler Reed** caught a 5-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter for his seventh touchdown catch of the season. Reed's seven touchdowns ties the NU season record for tight ends, tying four players, most recently Gerald Armstrong in 1992. Reed's seven TD catches are tied for the seventh-most in a season for all NU players.

► Senior receiver **Mike McNeill** caught a 36-yard pass on 4th and 1 in the second quarter. The reception pushed McNeill past 1,000 career receiving yards, making him the 19th Nebraska player to record 1,000 career receiving yards. McNeill now has 1,039 career receiving yards. McNeill finished the night with four catches for 63 yards, his best outing since a career-high five catches for 61 yards at Oklahoma State. It was just the second time this season McNeill has had more than two receptions.

► Sophomore I-back **Rex Burkhead** completed a 5-yard TD pass to Kyler Reed in the second quarter. Burkhead has thrown for touchdowns on all three of his career pass attempts--all in the past two weeks.

► Nebraska rushed for 145 yards in tonight's game, marking just the third time NU has not rushed for 200 yards. The Huskers are 10-0 when rushing for 200 yards and 0-3 when not reaching the 200-yard mark.

► Junior defensive tackle **Jared Crick** registered an eight-yard sack in the third quarter and shared a 14-yard sack in the fourth quarter, giving him 9.0 sacks this season and 18.5 in his career. Crick has 16 tackles for loss this season, bettering his 2009 total of 15.

► Sophomore safety **Courtney Osborne** registered his first career interception in the second quarter of tonight's game, setting up a short touchdown that gave Nebraska a 17-0 lead. Osborne became the eighth different defensive back with an interception in 2010.

► Nebraska led 20-17 at half of tonight's game and lost a halftime lead for only the second time under Pelini. NU entered the night 23-1 under Pelini when leading at halftime and the Huskers are now 23-2 when leading at the half.

► Sooner quarterback Landry Jones accounted for 339 yards of total offense in tonight's game, ending a streak of 29 straight games without allowing an opposing player to account for 300 yards of total offense. The previous player to record 300 yards of total offense was Kansas' Todd Reesing who had 339 yards of total offense on Nov. 8, 2008.

► Nebraska held Oklahoma to just 1-of-16 on third-down conversions in the game. The Sooners did convert 2-of-4 on fourth down.

► Tonight's game captains were seniors **Pierre Allen**, **Prince Amukamara**, **Alex Henery** and **Roy Helu Jr.**

THE MODERATOR: We're now joined by Coach Stoops and some of his players will be coming in in a couple of minutes. Coach, congratulations on the win and your thoughts on tonight's game?

COACH STOOPS: Thank you. I appreciate it. I guess I first want to start by just congratulating Nebraska again on an excellent season and a well-played, hard-fought game tonight. As I said all week, Bo Pelini and his whole staff have done a marvelous job in developing that team here in the last few years. Very physical, tough, well-coached team. Played with great discipline, and that was evident tonight.

I'm equally, of course, not equally, but just really proud of our players the way they stepped up and made plays. Especially through the second half. Answered the bell. We were down 17-0, and kept playing ball. Went in at halftime and told our guys, look, defensively in particular, we're not far off. We gave up two run plays. They had the one run popped in the first quarter, and then one at the end of the half.

Outside of that, we were playing well. And I knew, I said, listen, all we've got to do is stick to it in the second half and we're going to be in good shape. So be positive about what you're doing.

Offensively, we made some big plays. Stuck with it. It was tough going early, but then we caught our rhythm, and caught them in a few things, got them a few big plays that got things rolling a little bit.

So it was a good team win, and it's pretty special to have the last championship and to add to the number we already have is really pretty special for sure. Again, these players deserve the credit for it.

Q. Landry, this is for you. Obviously, this is a pretty accomplished secondary coming in. How were you able to put up the kind of numbers you did against them?

LANDRY JONES: They play a zone-match kind of thing. So we had great play coming in. Our coaches did a great job scheming for them and things like that. Got to give it to the people around me. They got open. They beat their guy that was covering them. Nebraska has obviously a great defense so they do a lot of good things. Did a lot of good things tonight.

But we were fortunate enough to make a lot of big plays on them. Kind of just our receivers. Our receivers did a great job beating the manned coverage.

Q. With all the stakes involved here, was this about as good a defensive second half or half of football that you've played all year?

COACH STOOPS: Sure. And, again, I'll throw in a good part of the first half. To hold these guys to 143 rushes for 145 yards with what they've been doing all year, shredding people. It was a great defensive effort.

Compliment the players. They tackled well. Outside of the one or two big plays, they were in position. Again, I thought that the coaches, Brent did an excellent job in working in just a short time, working on our 50-front again. That really showed up, and these guys played well. The players made plays. Got a lot of pressure as

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well. Forced a lot of turnovers, and they did a lot of good things.

Q. You've won a few titles over the years. Talk about how special this is this year with your group of players?

COACH STOOPS: Yeah, it's really neat. In this game with the stakes as they were, and the last one here at least for now, you know, and just to do it again recently. Just to have this one for these set of players with the older guys that are here. Not many older ones here right now, which is evident by the whole team.

There are just a whole bunch of young freshmen and sophomores that are really just special players. Hopefully we can keep chasing them.

Q. Talk about your receivers today. They had a big game against what some people considered the best secondary in college football. Made a bunch of plays for you especially there down the stretch.

COACH STOOPS: They really did. And my compliments to Nebraska's secondary and Bo and their structure and how they played. They are difficult to work the ball against. They do an excellent job. So we're proud of the guys that we have. Landry did a super job, then Cameron Kenney, again, steps up and had a huge night.

The main stays, Kenny Stills and Ryan Broyles for sure. All different guys stepped up and had their time.

When you're playing these guys, it takes all of them. You can't just go to a couple of guys. They make you work. And that's, again, give Kevin Wilson, and all our offensive coaches a lot of credit, too, for orchestrating it, and having enough things to go to and enough ways to try to work to shake some guys open, because it is not easy.

Q. For Pryce and then Coach, I hope you'll follow up. Pryce, talk about your game. We had you down for five sacks. Talk about your individual performance. How your defense came through and played so well in the second half. And Coach, I wish you would talk about Pryce and his development this season.

PRYCE MACON: Man, I didn't know it was that many, but I'll take it. But, hey a, coaches they got us ready to play. They've been telling us to finish. You know, we just had to go do it. There

was nothing else to do but to finish and get that victory.

COACH STOOPS: Again, Pryce did a great job all year. We are proud of him. He's been through a lot of adversity, some multiple injuries, but kept coming back, and he's rewarded for it. He's really played well here down the stretch. To play so well in the Big 12 Championship game is something that I'm sure he'll remember forever.

Some of it was blitzes. Some of it was our 50 front. Whether it was coverage, made them hold the ball and Pryce gets to them. Some of it some blitzes where we got to them quicker. But we got a lot of pressure and that was a big factor.

Q. In a game like this your offense has to persevere somewhat because Nebraska has a great defense and they're going to make some plays too. Could you talk about how your team did that, and Kenny, if you could follow up afterwards?

COACH STOOPS: Yeah, it was really exciting to see the maturity of us being down 17-0, no one being rattled, just keep working it. Keep playing football. It's a long night. So nothing is decided.

They did. They just kept chipping away at it, chipping away at it, and making plays when they had opportunities. And we really seized some good momentum in the second half and held on to it to finish.

KENNY STILLS: I just felt like we got down early, and nobody's heads went down. Everybody had the confidence that we were going to go back out there and make this a game. Like everybody else has been talking about, we've been talking about finishing and staying strong and going out there and playing a great second half, and that's what we did.

Q. Pryce, I've got to get more out of you. You're a fifth year guy. You had hardly played at all before this year, defensive end, not defensive tackle. Talk about your career. I know you've got another game to go, but your whole development, and of course this game?

PRYCE MACON: I'm not going to say it's been easy. But parents wouldn't let me quit, friends wouldn't let me quit. You know, I just kept grinding and God had a plan for me. I'm just glad that I stayed and stuck it out and kept fighting, because, hey, I couldn't see this going any better

than this.

So I'm happy for my decision for staying and working.

Q. You and Landry, if you will, you've often talked about the fact that you've had several different quarterbacks win these Big 12 Championships. I think this is the sixth different guy you've had. Could you comment on that, Coach, and then Landry?

COACH STOOPS: Sure. We are proud of the fact that it isn't any one guy. It's a team effort, and to be able to come back and win it multiple times with a lot of different players in different years is, you know, it just speaks to the consistency, I guess, and the overall quality of play through the years.

But it's always a team effort. But Landry had another special game. When you look at the quality of defense he was going up against.

LANDRY JONES: I just think I'm blessed just to be able to play this game and to win championships and things like that. God has been really good to me this year and blessed me with a lot of wins and allowed me to do some things on the field.

You know, so I'm just thankful. I'm thankful for the opportunity just to get to play here. Follow after, of course, like Sam, everybody knows about Sam, and Coach Heupel, and people like that. To be able to follow them and win championships like this. That's why a lot of people are attracted to Oklahoma because you know in this century, not in this century, in this decade we've won most of the Big 12 Championships here. So just thankful for the opportunity.

Q. I was wondering if you could talk about, just you and your staff, what this feels like. You talked about how young you are to come out after a down year last year and to win another Big 12 Championship, just how satisfying it is to see your program rebuild in that fashion?

COACH STOOPS: You know, I was really pleased at how we finished last year to play so well at the end of the year. It gave you a strong feeling that this was coming, or it could come. Even though we fought through all the injuries we did a year ago, we weren't far off. We had character. Our guys got better through the year. Showed improvement.

A lot of young guys that weren't supposed to play by the end of the year were playing well.

When you look at the Oklahoma State game and beating Stanford in the Sun Bowl.

So you felt that you took some big steps to lead into this. Then you put all of those guys back a year ago with the quality of young players and freshmen that we added, and they just kept growing through the year and getting better and better.

It's very gratifying and exciting to see so many young players play so well and to mesh so well with the older guys that we have.

Q. What did you specifically see on the fake punt that looked like it was coming? You got the timeout right before it started. Did you see something?

COACH STOOPS: Saw a different formation in there, they're usually in, and saw the motion start. As soon as I saw the motion start, I called a time out to be sure that we had our defense out there.

Q. Can you talk about the decision-making process of Landry all night long? It seems even when he had time in the pocket he didn't try to force it, and always made sure to throw it away when he had to?

COACH STOOPS: He did a great job of that. They are in tight coverage most of the time, so, you know, if you're throwing a ball off balance a little late, little behind, there is a great chance of it being tipped or intercepted.

So there are sometimes you've either got to eat it, throw it away or just give up on it. And he did a nice job in all those decision making times. And he came up with some clutch throws under pressure a few times and on the run. Found some guys late that really made a difference. The one we had 3rd and 20-something, and he picked up all but maybe a yard of it. Then we pick up the first down after that.

Q. Your interception in the end zone, they were in a situation where they could at least go up 20, maybe 24. Talk about how big a play that was just in general the defense and the pressure that you got on the quarterback?

TRAVIS LEWIS: It all starts with our defensive line. They did a great job getting pressure on it. And they ran a route that we expected to come and kind of baited them into throwing it. He threw across his body, and his

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hands ain't what they used to be, but God gave me the gift and I caught it. You know, so it was a huge play.

Q. Can you just describe the emotions that you felt tonight as you guys won this championship?

TRAVIS LEWIS: This is a great feeling. This is my third Big 12 Championship, and this one's definitely the sweetest. In the fashion that we won this game in. We always pride ourselves in defense wins championships. I felt like we got rattled a little early, gave up some big plays.

But we never panicked. We came right back in and shut down a pretty great offense and pretty great quarterback.

So defensive line played lights out. I give the game ball, all the game balls to them because those guys got so much pressure on the quarterback and made him really uncomfortable. So this is definitely the sweetest.

Q. What does it feel like to be going back to the BCS Bowl?

TRAVIS LEWIS: We're on a one-game winning streak, so I want you all to note that. This is huge. We've got to finish. We've been talking all season about finishing. We're on a pretty hot streak right now. I think all the players are satisfied that we finished strong.

But it's not over yet. To cap this season off to win a Bowl game, that would be awesome.

Q. Landry and Kenny, talk about those two big pass plays in the first half. Looked like on the second one you ad libbed it a little bit. Kenny came across the middle of the field, and you guys seemed to be on the same wave length there.

LANDRY JONES: Well, the first touchdown pass was just a post-route. And Kenny got behind him. Kind of laid it out there for him, and he used his speed to run past everybody and made a great grab. Took it into the end zone.

Then that one, it was kind of a stutter route, we were trying to go by him. That guy jammed him up a little bit, and I saw him break inside and put the ball out there for him and he made a great play. I thought he got in the end zone, but I guess the referees didn't.

KENNY STILLS: Yeah, Landry described that pretty well. The second one, we ran a little stutter move, and I figured I couldn't go outside. So I slipped him inside, and Landry and I

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happened to be on the same page. I thought I was in the end zone, too, but obviously not.

THE MODERATOR: Congratulations on the win. Good luck in the Bowl game.

COACH PELINI: Congratulations to Oklahoma, to their program, their football team. It was a hard-fought game. They earned it. We had our opportunities, and we didn't get it done. We came close. Our kids played hard. I'm proud of our football team and the effort they gave. I'll open it up for any questions.

THE MODERATOR: Questions for Coach Pelini.

Q. Bo, did you make the right call at quarterback starting Taylor?

COACH PELINI: Yes.

Q. Why did you go with Taylor?

COACH PELINI: Because he's our starting quarterback, and he was healthy.

Q. The second to last possession, you're at the 39, 3rd and 8. What did you feel you needed to get to get in range there?

COACH PELINI: We thought we were in range, that is the shame of it. But can't take a sack in that situation.

Q. Can you talk about Taylor's performance and his effort tonight?

COACH PELINI: Gave great effort. There are some things he could have done better,

obviously. But it extends well beyond the quarterback position. You know, he thought he did some going things. He did some things that, obviously, we'd like to have back.

Q. Looked like you had fake punt that you were going to call there before Oklahoma called timeout. Could you talk about what the call was and what you were thinking in that situation?

COACH PELINI: No, I'm not talking about that. Next question.

Q. You feel like you guys let one slip away building that 17-point lead and then, obviously just held to three points the last two and a half quarters?

COACH PELINI: Yes. Like I said, I thought we had our opportunities. We didn't get it done, and fell short.

THE MODERATOR: Questions for the student-athletes.

Q. Talk about Rex's play again, he seemed to make some great runs there especially out of the Wildcat in the second half?

COACH PELINI: Yeah, I thought Rex played well. He did some good things. Obviously, the fumble hurt us. We just did too many things out there to overcome it and beat a good football team. We put the football on the ground too many times. We lost the turnover battle, and took some sacks in some big situations.

We left some points out on the board. We just didn't make enough plays. We didn't do what was necessary to win the game.

Q. Can you just talk about the level of disappointment with this, the goal?

COACH PELINI: It's pretty obvious what the level of disappointment is. We came in here to win the Big 12 Championship. We didn't get it

done. The kids are hurting, and it's a pretty obvious question, isn't it?

Q. Could you talk about Taylor's efforts throughout the game tonight?

REX BURKHEAD: I thought he led the huddle really well. He got us in and out. He's a tough kid. He was competing out there. He got us ready to go, and, I mean, we just didn't finish. But I thought he played well.

Q. The quarterback thing was a big topic all week. Can you shed some light on what your thought process was and when you came to a decision?

COACH PELINI: I knew who was going to play on Monday. I just didn't feel it was the right thing to share. He had a good week of practice. He practiced all week, and I didn't feel that people were entitled to know that he was going to start.

Our football team knew he was going to start. I was pretty -- I was about 90% sure that he was going to go, but you never know when somebody has been hurt. You don't know what's going to happen throughout a week of practice.

Q. You said he was healthy? Did you feel like he was --

COACH PELINI: He ran around fine. There was no question on his health.

Q. Roy, can you talk about your long touchdown run, how that play developed and what happened?

ROY HELU JR.: It was just really good blocking. And I think Brandon or one of the receivers made a really good block down field, and I didn't do too much.

Q. Can you just talk about the way Landry Jones threw the football? Looked like he made some pretty big time throws out there tonight to get the ball around the yard?

COACH PELINI: Yeah, I thought Landry made some good throws. He's a good football player. He has some good weapons around him, and he's going to make plays. You're not going to sit there and hold the football team with those weapons to zero points. But our defense I thought played well.

Q. Can you talk about your defense a little bit and how they played tonight? It

seemed that they kept you hanging in there as much as they could.

COACH PELINI: I think I just addressed that, but I thought our defense played very well. And I thought they did a lot of good things out there. It's a good football team. Good offensive football team we played tonight.

Q. When you guys took the sack and then OU was called for an offside penalty, and you had the ball at the 45, did kicking a field goal there cross your mind from 62 yards?

COACH PELINI: Yeah, I mean, you look back I wish we would have. But we got the ball back, so, you know. If you kick it there and they have that kind of field position, the game's over. I thought we could stop them. We did. We got the football back. Had an opportunity and didn't make the most of it.

Q. Jared, can you talk about Oklahoma's offensive tempo and what kind of problems, if any, they gave you?

JARED CRICK: We knew coming in they'd run a fast tempo offense. We had practiced for it; we were ready for it. I didn't think they caught us off guard at all. Just for the preparation that we had against it. And we saw it against Oklahoma State, and again last year when we played Oklahoma. So we were ready for it.

I don't really think their fast tempo of offense really hurt us by any means.

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
