The Big 12 enters its 18th year as it continues to promote the strength and success of one of the nation's premier athletic conferences under the direction of second-year commissioner Bob Bowlsby.

TCU and West Virginia joined the league on July 1, 2012 and became the Big 12's first additions since inception, joining Baylor, Iowa State, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Texas and Texas Tech.

With 10 members, the Big 12 remains as the only major conference in the nation to determine its champions in all sports directly on the field of play with a full round-robin schedule.

The Conference's hard work ethic and strong values have translated to enormous success in its first 17 years. Since it began competition in 1996-97, the league can boast of 52 NCAA team titles and 537 individual national championships.

The trophy case added more hardware in 2012-13 as Texas won the NCAA Championship in women's volleyball and the Oklahoma State men's cross country team captured its third national title in the last four seasons. Oklahoma State won the Western crown in equestrian while Oklahoma became one of just five programs to capture multiple national championships in softball. The year ended with Kansas hoisting its first NCAA trophy in women's outdoor track and field. Additionally, the Big 12 picked up 20 individual national titles.

Several other sports also made strong national showings a year ago. Big 12 football sent a national-record 90 percent of its teams to bowl games. Women's basketball claimed the top position in conference RPI for the sixth consecutive season and was the only league to place 80 percent of its teams in postseason play and 70 percent in the NCAA Championship. Baylor won the Big 12's first men's basketball NIT title. Kansas indoor track & field, Oklahoma women's gymnastics and Oklahoma State wrestling finished as runner-up in their respective national championships. Additionally, Texas joined Oklahoma in the Softball College World Series while K-State and Oklahoma competed in baseball Super Regionals.

Individually, Baylor center Brittney Griner earned consensus women's basketball national player of the year for the second season. Oklahoma State's Marcus Smart was named National Freshman of the Year by two different outlets, while Jeff Withey of Kansas was selected the National Association of Basketball Coaches Defensive Player of the Year. Texas volleyball head coach Jerrett Elliott received American Volleyball Coaches Association Coach of the Year honors.

Oklahoma pitcher Keilani Ricketts repeated as the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, giving the Big 12 two of the three all-time multiple winners as former Texas player Cat Osterman earned the award three times. Ricketts also claimed the Honda Award for softball for the second consecutive season and the Honda Cup, given to the nation's top female collegiate athlete by the Collegiate Women's Sports Awards. Kansas track & field head coach Stanley Redwine and assistant coach Wayne Pate each earned national accolades as the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) awarded the two with outdoor coach of the year honors.

The Big 12 lays claim to five Heisman Trophy winners since 1996 and has had a finalist in 12 of its 17 seasons – the most of any league. Seventeen athletes have earned major individual awards in football in the past five campaigns. Overall, more than 1,400 student-athletes have earned All-America recognition in the past five years alone.

Through its first 17 years, the Big 12 has claimed a team national championship in 16 of the sports it sponsors. The Conference ranks second with seven appearances in the BCS National Championship Game and is second with 96 football consensus All-America selections in that time. League squads combined to lead the nation in women's basketball attendance 13 consecutive years and the Big 12 is the only conference to surpass the one-million mark in season attendance – doing so six times. In men's basketball, the league is the only conference in the nation where every coach has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament, including six coaches that have led teams to the Final Four. During the last nine years a total of 31 NCAA trophies have been hoisted by Big 12 institutions, with at least one national crown won in all but one year for the Conference, including 16 consecutive seasons.

The Big 12 and its member institutions are committed to a competitive environment where sportsmanship and fair play take center stage. Whether on the field, in the classroom, or within the community, the student-athletes, administrators, coaches and game officials of the Big 12 support the highest ideals in sportsmanship.

National academic accolades have always been strong in the Big 12. Danielle Robinson (Oklahoma) and Sam Acho (Texas) were selected to receive Today's Top VIII Awards – one of the NCAA's top honors. It recognizes student-athletes who completed their athletic eligibility during 2010-11 for success on the fields and courts, in the classroom and in the community. In the last two seasons,



three student-athletes were recipients of the NCAA Elite 89 Award. That honor showcases individuals who have reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level, while also achieving the highest academic standard among their peers.

In its short history, the Big 12 has had 537 Academic All-America recipients, averaging more than 30 each season. Big 12 student-athletes have shown commitment to their studies by earning numerous individual academic recognitions. Nine times in the past eight years a league athlete has garnered the top academic honor for their respective sport. The Big 12 had plenty of success overall in the classroom the last four years, as the Conference boasted 80 student-athletes earning Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America recognition through the fall of 2012.

The Big 12 can take pride in other stories that combine on and off the field success. Patience Knight (Texas Tech) was the recipient of the Honda Inspiration Award in 2008, given to an outstanding female college athlete who overcomes adversity to excel in her sport. She was diagnosed with a cancerous tumor in 2007, but rebounded to win All-America honors at the NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships. Oklahoma State women's basketball was the inaugural recipient of the "Together We R" Team Award in 2012, recognizing programs that have strived to succeed in the face of adversity. Following a devastating tornado south of Oklahoma City just before the Big 12 Baseball Championship in 2013, several league baseball teams along with other student-athletes, coaches and former Conference players contributed help in a variety of ways. Plus, the Conference contributed \$200,000 to the relief efforts.

Competitive excellence, scholarship and sportsmanship are all equal components of the Big 12 philosophy. All-Big 12 teams and Academic All-Big 12 squads are recognized for each sport at the end of their respective seasons. At the end of each academic year, the Conference honors its top male and female student-athletes with the Big 12 Athlete of the Year and Big 12 Sportsman of the Year awards.

Institutions can also nominate student-athletes for the prestigious Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarships. A total of 313 scholars have received near \$2.2 million in postgraduate financial aid through the first 17 years of the program.

The Big 12 sponsors 23 sports. Men's squads include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and wrestling. Women's teams are fielded in basketball, cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis and volleyball.

Big 12 institutions create a league that encompasses five states and nearly 37 million people. More than 4,200 student-athletes from across the United States and around the World compete annually in the sports sponsored by the Conference.

The Conference conducts postseason championships for 20 of its 23 sports. Each championship helps to determine teams and/or individuals that will represent the Conference in national postseason competition. The winner of the Big 12 football regular season championship earns the league's berth into the Bowl Championship Series.

In its first 17 years, the Conference has distributed more than \$1.8 billion to its member institutions. The conference office is headquartered in Irving, Texas.

The Big 12 Conference maintains its website at Big12Sports.com. Complete information on the league and the member schools is available.



The site boasts original content from throughout the Conference along with several video broadcasts, including a daily update (Big 12 Minute). In men's basketball, condensed game highlights of numerous contests will be available via the Big 12 Digital Network, within 72 hours of a game's completion. Many parts of the Big 12 Digital Network - including video - are also available via an application on various mobile platforms (iPhones, iPads, Android). Comprehensive live coverage of media day in October and the 2014 Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship in March is also available.

In men's basketball, scores throughout the league, standings and box scores are updated as games are final. Big 12 conference and team statistics are updated no later than the following morning, with weekly award winners posted each Monday. An archive of conference and team-by-team statistics for every season in league history is included as well.

Media can access Acrobat PDF files of the daily release, statistics, team-by-team statistics and the conference media guide on the website.

Periodic updates are posted, including selected game updates and other conference-related information. Big 12 Release

The Big 12 will update a media release, including team notes, results and more each morning after games are played during the season. Complete league statistics, in addition to team-by-team stats for all 10 league squads, will be updated via the conference website as well.

Phillips 66 Weekly Awards

A Big 12 Player and Rookie of the Week will be chosen each Monday, beginning November 11. Nominations are submitted by the school media relations offices and winners are selected by a panel of media voters who cover the league on a regular basis. This year marks the 18th year for Phillips 66 as a sponsor of the Big 12 Conference.

The show is produced by Randy Heritage with Chad McKee as the primary host. Segments of both programs are available via the Big 12 website.

Championship Credentials

Media credentials for the 2014 Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship are authorized and issued by the Conference office. An online credential system, provided through an agreement with Sports Systems Services, Inc., is the only method to submit requests. The credential system will be made available during the month of January.

Postseason Awards

The Big 12 presents the only official all-conference awards at the end of the regular season. Major award winners are chosen, along with the All-Big 12 teams. Each Big 12 head coach votes on the squads and is not permitted to vote for his own players. The awards will be announced in March prior to the Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship. Academic All-Big 12 teams are also chosen in men's basketball and will be announced prior to the postseason.

Big 12 Coaching - The Nation's Best

The Big 12 has a lineup of head coaches that is unmatched by any other conference in the country. Every coach in the league has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament - the only conference in the nation that can boast of that feat.

In addition, six of the head coaches in the Big 12 have guided teams to the Final Four at some point in their careers - the most of any conference. Five boast at least 500 career victories.

Eight of 10 head coaches have a minimum of 225 career wins while every head coach in the Big 12 has recorded a winning career record.

More Coaching Success

Big 12 coaching success and recognition isn't limited to total victories. League mentors have also led their teams to numerous conference titles, while also being recognized often by their peers for the success. Below is a breakdown of regular-season and postseason awards for each coach.

A Standard In The Sweet 16

When Kansas advanced to the regional semifinals in 2013, it marked the 15th consecutive season that at least one Big 12 squad has made the Sweet 16. Ninety percent of league squads have made the regional semifinals since 2000, with 80 percent advancing since 2005. Both percentages lead the nation. The Big 12 has had at least one regional semifinalist in all but one year in conference history.

Baylor Captures First NIT Crown For Big 12

Baylor captured the first NIT Championship for the Big 12 since the league began play in 1996-97 when the Bears defeated BYU and Iowa at Madison Square Garden. BU was the third Big 12 squad in the past five years

to advance to the NIT semifinals. Overall, Baylor is 21-8 in postseason games (conference or national) in the last five seasons.

Self, Barnes Hold Top Two Spots

Rick Barnes of Texas and Bill Self of Kansas rank prominently on the all-time Big 12 coaching wins lists, with the duo first and second on each. Barnes holds the No. 1 spot in victories for all games played (358) during his time in the league, while Self ranks second (300). The rankings are the same for conference regular-season games only, with Barnes at 167 victories and Self with 137 wins. Baylor mentor Scott Drew is also high on the overall chart, checking in at No. 7 with 178 career wins during his time in Waco.

Attracting Top Talent

Big 12 teams continue to do well on the recruiting trail, as seven programs ranked in the top 40 of the final ESPN.com recruiting rankings for the class of 2013. It marks the fifth straight season that the league has had at least four teams among the final top 30 of the rankings.

RPI Consistency

Recently, the Big 12 has shown remarkable consistency in finishing highly-rated in the final RPI. The Conference has been ranked among the top five conferences in final RPI (post-NCAA Championship) in six straight seasons and 11 of 12 years since 2002. In five of the last six campaigns, the league has been among the top three, including a No. 1 finish in 2009-10.

Big 12 - SEC Challenge On Tap

The first Big 12/SEC Challenge will play out over six weeks, with a majority of the games scheduled for December 2-6. Three games take place outside the four-day series window due to scheduling issues. In future years, the two conferences will work with ESPN to schedule all games across consecutive days.



This will be the first challenge for Big 12 men's basketball since a four-year series between the Conference and the Pac-10 from 2007-10. The Big 12 held a 28-20 advantage in games played in that event.

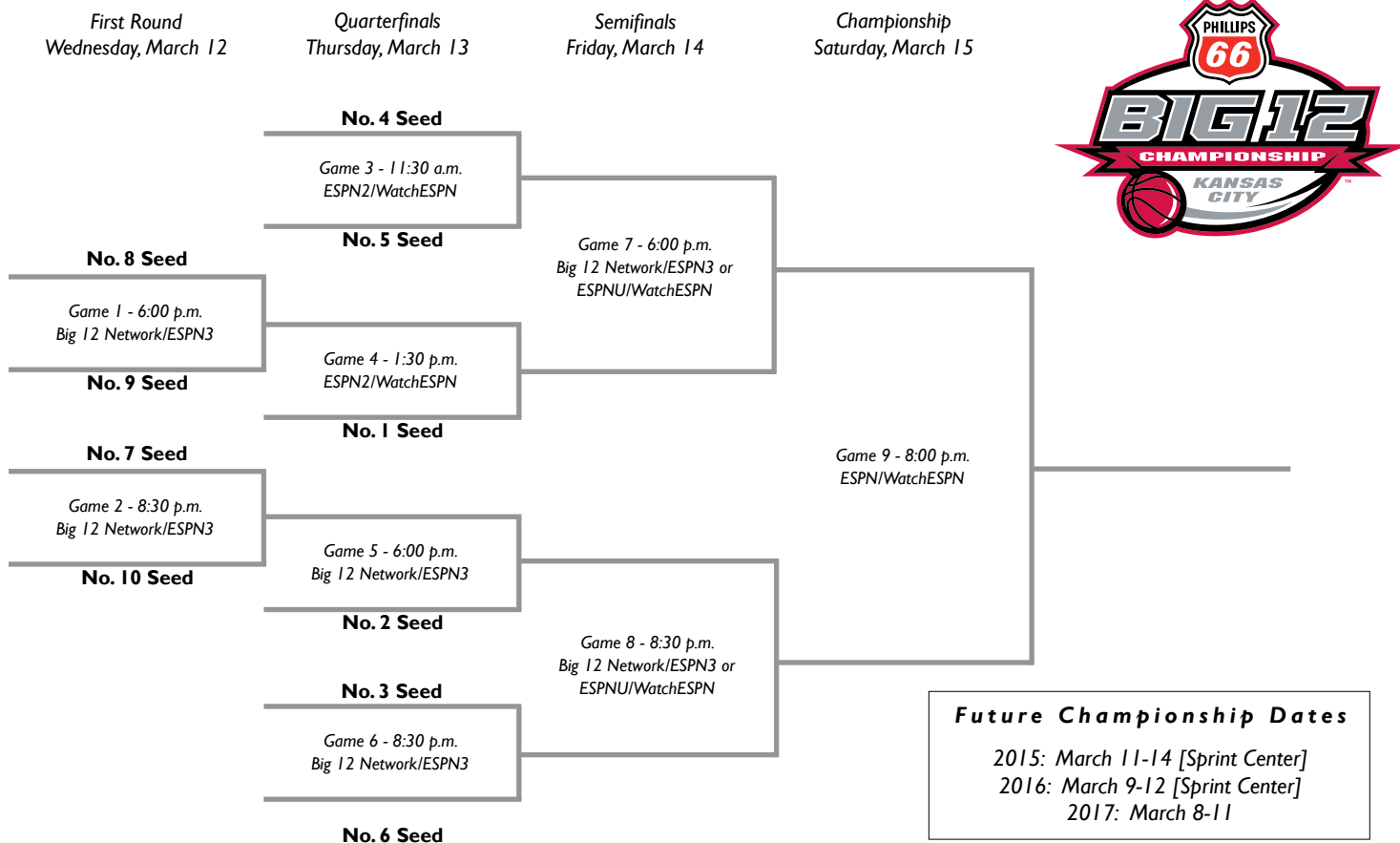
Entering the 2013-14 campaign, at least one conference team has been ranked every week since the Big 12 began competition in 1996-97, a span of 326 consecutive weeks.

The Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship will continue in Kansas City in 2014, with Sprint Center hosting the league championship for the sixth time. All 10 institutions will participate with seeding based on regular season finish. The top six squads in the conference standings earn first-round byes. The Big 12 Champion earns the league's automatic bid to the 68-team NCAA Championship field. The entire Big 12 Championship will be televised on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN Full Court, ESPN3 or the Big 12 Network.

CHAMPIONSHIP TIEBREAKING PROCEDURES

Seeding for the Championship will be based upon regular-season competition. The winner of the postseason basketball championship shall be declared the Big 12 automatic qualifier to the NCAA Championship. A team ineligible under NCAA or Big 12 rules for postseason competition shall not compete in the championship.

Tiebreakers - The first criteria in the breaking of ties in the standings shall be head-to-head competition of tied teams. The following procedure will be used to establish the postseason championship seeds when ties exist.

Ties Involving Two Teams

- Results of head-to-head competition during the regular season.
- Each team's record vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular-season standings, and then continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage. When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.
- A comparison of the tied teams Conference-games only road record.
- A comparison of the tied teams Conference-games only road record vs. the team(s) occupying the highest position in the final Conference regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage. When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.
- Draw. In the event tiebreaking procedures are unsuccessful and a draw is necessary in determining any portion of seeding, the following procedure will be used:
 - The draw will be conducted in public or with media attendance.
 - Institutions involved in the drawing have the right to have a local representative in attendance at the drawing.
 - A single slip of paper for each institution (with name or logo) will be placed into a container and will be drawn in order of seeding from highest to lowest.

Ties Involving More than Two Teams

- Results of collective head-to-head competition during the regular season among the tied teams (mini round-robin).
- If more than two teams are still tied, each of the tied team's record vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings, eliminating tied teams with inferior records until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

- If more than two teams are still tied, a comparison of the tied teams Conference-games only road record.
- If more than two teams are still tied, a comparison of the tied teams Conference-games only road record vs. the team(s) occupying the highest position in the final Conference regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standing until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

- If at any point the multiple-team tie is reduced to two teams, the two-team tie-breaking procedures above will be applied.
- Once a team is eliminated from a multi-team comparison, it is dropped from further comparisons.

Since the first season of conference competition, the Big 12 has always guaranteed its teams extensive national television coverage. This year, the Big 12 Conference continues its long-standing relationship with the ESPN family of networks in men's basketball, including ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN3.

In addition, Conference games are provided to CBS through the partnership with ESPN. The Big 12 and ESPN have entered into a long-term contract that runs through the 2024-25 season. When the original agreement was signed, the Big 12 was the first conference to be guaranteed three weekly telecast windows on ESPN or ESPN2. A total of 100-105 games will air annually with a minimum of 83 contests broadcast by ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU. Selected games will also be available on ESPN3 and WatchESPN as well as ESPN Full Court, the network's outer-market pay subscription service. The telecasts listed below were known at press time.

The Big 12 Conference maintains long-term television agreements to ensure the greatest exposure for its men's basketball programs. Included below is a breakdown of these rights and how they affect which games are televised, and when they are shown.

ESPN has the rights to 100-105 games, plus all games of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship.

Of those contests:

- Forty-three games (minimum of 30 Conference games) will be televised on either ESPN or ESPN2
- Guaranteed national telecasts on Monday, Wednesday and Saturdays during Conference play
- Ability to sublicense 20 additional games to a national over-the-air or cable outlet
- Up to 40 games per year on ESPNU and six additional games on ESPN3
- Remaining selected games on Big 12 Network

Appearance Requirements

There are no appearance requirements (minimums or maximums) for games on the various ESPN platforms.

Game Times/Exclusive Windows

As opposed to some previous seasons, there are only a few exclusive windows in men's basketball.

- Institutional packages are restricted from televising games during Big Monday telecast windows and Saturday prime times windows when a Big 12 school is hosting College Game Day. There are fully protected two-hour windows.





Distribution of Institutional (Local) Package Games

ESPN controls the national/regional distribution of games and the contract may limit the geographical reach of institutional (third-tier or local) package games to the state(s) of the participating team(s).

The guidelines for the distribution of these games include the following.

- Telecasts may be distributed only within the states (and overlapping DMAs) of the two participating teams, except when a game is distributed via a member institution branded outlet
- At its option, institutions may present the telecasts to ESPN for placement on ESPN Full Court
- Unselected games produced as part of the local package may be distributed by school websites

Revenue Distribution Process

Basketball television revenue is divided equally among all member institutions. Each member retains the revenue it receives for their local packages (whether or not they are with ABC/ESPN, FOX or another entity).
